As chairman of the North Branford Library Board, elected to office by vote of the town at the November election, I am in receipt of a letter sent by you to Mr. Hill concerning the library situation. The board meets on Tuesday evening, March 30, and we would be most happy to consider any recommendations concerning the proposed library which you might see fit to present.

Our selectman, Alden J. Hill, with the assistance of our town clerk, R. Marie Deers, has, through the town attorney, Ellsworth B. Foote, placed before the State Legislature, a bill to clear the title of the Town Green, the most historic spot in our village. The committee hearing will be on Wednesday, March 24, and will be attended by several of us. The town has also appropriated the sum of \$200 as a grant for the town year of 1936-1937.

Let me assure you, Mr. Atwater, that we stand undivided in favor of your proposed memorial library. We will be only too happy to do all that can be done to assist you in this generous project.
