Gentlemen:

The early part of last week I ordered two copies of Willkie's book, "One World," from you, one copy to be sent to the Atwater Memorial Library at North Branford, Connecticut, one copy to be sent to my office at 44 Vernon St., Springfield, Mass.

I received my copy at 44 Vernon Street last Saturday and find it is an imperfect copy. In the chapter on Our Ally, Russia, you will find on the third page of this chapter page "52" and on the next page number "21." In other words, the book has been improperly bound. Then the second duplication goes from page 52 to page 85.

I think what I have written will make it possible for you to send me a correct copy.

If the copy sent to the Atwater Memorial Library was like the one sent to me, you will have to send the corrected one to them and ask them to return the imperfect copy to you. Perhaps the librarian has not looked through the copy sent to the Atwater Memorial Library and so does not know whether the copy is imperfect or not. I am writing her at this time and sending her a copy of this letter so that when you write her she will have a better understanding of whether the book is wrong or right.

Thank you for sending the book so promptly and on receipt of a perfect copy and word from the Atwater Memorial Library that they have received a perfect copy I will mail you check covering the two books.

I am returning my imperfect copy to you by parcel post.
